Performances will happen at Corbans Estate Arts Centre—a ceramic firing spectacle and at Objectspace, where Empire of Dirt curator Doris de Pont will perform one of the commissioned texts accompanying the ceramics on exhibition. Works by Campbell Hegan, Ande Barrett-Hegan, Kate Fitzharris, **Emily Siddell, Richard Stratton and Paul** Hartigan will be on exhibition at Brendan Adams Front Room Gallery, Masterworks, Anna Miles Gallery and Gus Fisher Gallery.
