- Confirmation that you can attend the day of the workshop.

Selections will be confirmed by 20 December 2014. Objectspace aims to provide opportunities for writers working within the fields of craft, design and applied art, and so eligibility is given to writing projects that will contribute to discourse in these fields. Please note that the workshop is fully catered and a nominal fee of \$20 per person is required. Attendance is free. Participants will need to bring their own laptops or writing materials.

Benjamin Lignel is a French designer, writer and curator. He is a co-founder of *la garantie, association pour le* bijou, a French association with a mission to study and promote jewellery. In this capacity, he helped program and organise the 44th Zimmerhof symposium (2012) in Germany as well as "Bijou(x). Les Pratiques contemporaine à l'épreuve de leur discours" (2014) a two-day symposium hosted by Paris College of Art. He has contributed to magazines and publications and is a member of Think Tank. A European Initiative for the Applied Arts. He has been the editor of Art Jewelry Forum since 2013 and is currently working on a book on exhibition-making. Benjamin visited New Zealand in 2014 as the guest of Creative New Zealand and Objectspace and is returning in 2015 as a contributor to the Handshake2 project organised be Peter Deckers
